
Help Us Celebrate Public Power Week

Residents throughout Klickitat County are invited to stop by the Goldendale and White Salmon offices for refreshments and free logo items on Friday, October 8, from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. to help us celebrate Public Power Week and Klickitat PUD's 72 years in operation.

"Public Power Week is a chance for Klickitat PUD to articulate why public power is a good fit for the communities throughout Klickitat County," says Ray Mosbrucker, president of the Klickitat PUD Board of Commissioners. "We are dedicated to providing quality services while maintaining the lowest rates possible."

Public Power Week is a national, annual event sponsored in conjunction

with the American Public Power Association (APPA) in Washington, D.C. APPA is the service organization for community- and state-owned utilities.

"We are proud to be a public power community," Ray says. "Our focus goes beyond serving customers. We serve the community. Klickitat PUD knows how important it is to keep the lights on for our communities, and we continue to find ways to do so with special dedication to reliability, safety and the environment."

Klickitat PUD was created in 1938 and

now has 80 employees. The utility owns the H.W. Hill Landfill Gas Power Plant, named in honor of Harold W. Hill, who served as a commissioner for 30 years. Klickitat PUD also has a 13-percent share of the White Creek I Wind Farm in Roosevelt, and 50-percent ownership of the McNary Hydro Fishway Project in conjunction with Northern Wasco PUD.


About 10,000 residential, 1,800 commercial, and two large industrial customers make up our customer base. KPUD service territory includes 1,310 miles of overhead, 263 miles of underground distribution line and 152 miles of transmission line. The utility owns 23 substations. Also included in KPUD's business portfolio are 10 water and six wastewater systems throughout the county, owned and/or operated by Klickitat PUD.

KPUD Uses a Variety Of Energy Sources

The Washington Department of Community, Trade and Economic Development (CTED) conducts an annual survey of all electric utilities operating within the state to determine the generation source of the electric energy sold to the utilities' respective retail customers.

CTED uses this information to develop a statewide database and provides each electric utility with a "fuel mix report" listing the fuel types used in providing their electric service.
