The Klickitat PUD summer internship program encompasses several different internships.

Office clerk interns help most departments. Students gain valuable skills while performing a variety of tasks and work on projects. Common projects are writing Ruralite articles, calling water-wastewater customers with specific data, and helping create and distribute planned power outage letters to customers.

Warehouse interns help clean and wash vehicles used at the PUD and help organize materials crews use out of the warehouse.

The internship within the IT department was new this year while the internship with the line and tree crews were resurrected after being idle for several years.

The engineering internship is administered through Energy Northwest. The Public Power Internship Program is in partnership with several Pacific Northwest utilities. These interns get hands-on experience with real-world applications of what they are learning in college. As someone who has been a part of the KPUD

summer student internship for multiple summers, this program has evolved over the years. Last summer, the schedule was built around weekly meetings and focused on a variety of business etiquette and real-world tips and tricks regarding the workforce.

This summer, the focus was on getting out of the office and exploring more of what KPUD does in the field. There were field trips to the Renewable Natural Gas Plant in Roosevelt, tours of water-wastewater treatment plants and exploration of substations with Meter Shop Superintendent Jim Brokaw.

We still have meetings, but they are mostly focused on current projects.

Klickitat PUD hopes to educate students during the summer on how a utility runs and show the variety of career opportunities available through the utility.

Giving students firsthand experience of the KPUD work environment allows them to see if they want to work here in the future.
