Klickitat's New Wastewater System is Complete

The new wastewater system recently installed in the town of Klickitat consists of interceptor tanks to catch the biosolids and a treatment plant to treat the effluent.

The new system of interceptor tanks is a biosolids removal system that may need to be pumped out on an average of every three years.

The Interceptor Tank Process

Your interceptor tank is a large watertight structure in which organic solids are trapped. Sewage slows as it flows through the tank to allow solids to settle. The liquid is then filtered as it continues on to the wastewater treatment plant.

A four-person family will typically need their tank pumped out every two to three years.

Reminder DO's and Don'ts For Using Your New Interceptor Tanks

- **DO** limit the use of garbage disposals. Ground-up foods increase the solids in the interceptor tanks, creating a need for additional pumping.
- DO limit the use of bleach in your washer and wash only full loads
- **DO** ensure KPUD access to tank manhole for inspection, plumbing and maintenance.
- **DON'T** pour kitchen grease into drains.
- **DON'T** flush cigarette butts, sanitary napkins or other inorganic material down the toilet.

Improper use of the system leads to additional pumping. ■
