By the 20th, most of the county's power was restored, with only a few isolated customers still waiting for further repairs.

One of KPUD's linemen, Martin Taylor, was injured on the 19th, while restoring power to the Laurel area. He fell 20 feet down a pole, breaking a vertebra in his back. Martin is home now and his prognosis is good.
