## BPA Rebates Go Back to You

I have written from time to time about payments that are made by KPUD to Bonneville Power Administration (BPA) to send on to private utilities such as Pacificorp. Public power disagreed with this practice so vehemently that we took BPA to court. The court agreed with us. BPA suspended payments to the private companies.

BPA has now rebated a portion of this money back to Klickitat PUD (KPUD). It is more than \$1 million. With help from you, the board decided the best way to return the money to you—the people who paid for it—was with a rebate on your power bill. KPUD's board of commissioners voted to do this on the bill you receive in December. It amounts to a 61.6-percent reduction. I sure hope it makes a difference for you. Now, what to do with an early Christmas present? Below is my suggestion.
