Klickitat PUD recently hired two new workers for the meter shop: Jeremy Kerns and Rylee Van Belle.

KPUD's meter shop employees are responsible for testing, programming and maintaining equipment used in KPUD's electrical system. This includes voltage regulation equipment on transmission and distribution power line structures and customer's meters.

They also work on equipment and programming for projects, and provide monitoring equipment repairs and troubleshooting for the Water/Wastewater Department.

Both Kerns and Van Belle joined KPUD in October 2021 as substation wiremen.

"Jeremy has really picked up on all assigned projects," says Meter Shop Superintendent Jim Brokaw. "His technical expertise has been very helpful to the utility."
