## GENERAL MANAGER'S REPORT TO THE BOARD

For the March 26, 2019 Meeting

### **AGENDA ITEMS:**

- A. Prequalification of Contractors- Staff is recommending approval of Trenchless Pipe Repairs, LLC as a new small works contractor.
- B. Policy 21- Customer Service Policy- Staff is recommending approval of the revisions as highlighted.
- C. Electric Rate Increase Initial proposal- The approved 2019 Budget demonstrated an increase in our revenue requirement of 1.5% of retail electric revenues. This was proposed as a 1.5% flat electric rate increase. Initial reviews indicate that we are slightly behind in our revenues year to date, so staff is recommending that we implement the 1.5% rate increase as budgeted.
- D. Set Electric Rate Hearing Date- At this time, we do not show any changes to our original outlook that would lead us to believe that the Electric rate increase is not required, so staff is recommending that we set the Electric Rate public hearing date for April 23<sup>rd</sup>, 2019 at 3:00 p.m.

### **NON-AGENDA ITEMS:**

- 1. **RNG Dedication** the event is tentatively planned for June 1<sup>st</sup>. We are also planning on taking employees to the site in two shifts on the preceding day so they can tour the facility and talk with the RNG staff. We have no confirmation regarding the Governor as Keynote Speaker, and will be fixing the date in a couple of weeks regardless. Although his staff are still engaged in discussions with us regarding his attendance, I think our chances of getting him there are slim at this point. We are considering alternatives. If you have suggestions, they would be appreciated
- 2. Replacement of the Klickitat PUD Phone System Our current phone system has had increasing problems with hardware and software in the past year. The system is approximately 12 years old and the core of it was based on the system before that. These problems have had direct impacts on staff and on our customers. Issues have included inability to dial, voicemails delivered late and voice mail ceasing to operate for various users. Parts are becoming extremely hard to find and our support for the system has all but ceased.

We have researched multiple options and we are planning on upgrading both the phone and voice mail system to one that has the ability to grow with the utility. Our goal will be a system that can integrate into NISC for customer and employee communications and notifications.

As per RCW 39.04.270, we can participate in competitive negotiations and not competitive bidding. We are moving forward with a request for proposals that complies with the RCW. We do not need formal authorization from you, but I wanted to make you aware. We expect that we will be within

budget amounts.

- 3. <u>United States Army Corps of Engineers Lease at John Day</u> Brian checked with his Corps contact today. All the applications and supporting details have been accepted and they are processing the funding agreement. We are completing a formal land survey for the easement. We have been assured that the easement timing will work and no one else has any requests that interfere with ours.
- 4. <u>Legislative Update</u> The 100% Clean Energy bill is set for executive session in the Finance Committee on March 26<sup>th</sup>. It must pass through Finance before it is scheduled for a vote in committee.

The Net Metering bill is set for executive session in the House Environment and Energy Committee on the 26<sup>th</sup> as well. The bill has been well supported and that support is expected to continue.

Our DNR bill was scheduled yesterday for executive session in the House, but they did not get to it. No further word at this time.

Our RNG Tax bill passed unanimously out of the Senate Committee on Environment, Energy and Technology. It is now in Ways and Means.

5. <u>Public Generating Pool</u> – I attended the March meeting this week. Power Management VPs from Puget Sound Energy and Avista were guest speakers. Extremely good session and I will go through the interesting perspectives at the meeting.
