



## Keep Power Poles Free Of Debris

A wooden power pole might seem like a great place to put up a sign, but it is illegal to do so in the state of Washington. More importantly, it creates a danger to utility line workers.

Staples, tacks or nails used to attach signs, such as community event notices or garage sale signs, to power poles can trip up a line worker, or pierce and tear the worker's protective clothing or safety equipment, which could result in injury or electrocution.

Abuse of power poles also can cause premature damage and make it necessary to replace the pole.

Show the line workers you care: Keep power poles clean and safe. ■

When he's not at work, Mel enjoys spending time outdoors, and is ready to hike some of the great trails the Columbia River Gorge has to offer.


Mel is also a sports enthusiast and is a lifelong Kansas City Royals baseball fan.
