Discover Pass 'Free Days' for 2019

The Washington State Parks and Recreation Commission offers 12 free days each year when visitors are not required to display a Discover Pass for a day visit to a park. We hope you will take advantage of a state parks free day to get out and sample a new park or revisit an old favorite, then consider supporting state recreation lands by buying a Discover Pass.

The Discover Pass provides a year of vehicle access to millions of acres of parks, trails, water access sites and wildlife areas on state-managed recreation lands.

Free days for 2019:

- **January 1:** New Year's Day and State Parks' First Day Hike.
- **January 21:** Martin Luther King Jr. Day.
- **Tuesday, March 19:** Washington State Park birthday.
- **Saturday, April 20:** Spring day.
- **Monday, April 22:** Earth Day.
- **Saturday, June 1:** National Trails Day.
- **Saturday, June 8:** National Get Outdoors Day.
- **Sunday, June 9:** Fishing Day.
- **Sunday, August 25:** National Park Service birthday.
- **Saturday, September 28:** National Public Lands Day.
- **Monday, November 11:** Veterans Day.
- **Friday, November 29:** Autumn day.

Free days are offered only in state parks. The Discover Pass is still required when visiting land managed by the Washington Department of Fish and Wildlife and Department of Natural Resources. For more information about the Discover Pass and how to buy one, visit www.discoverpass.wa.gov. ■
