New regulations mandate transparency for residential solar installers, necessitating updated licensing requirements, contract language with specific provisions, and comprehensive notices and disclosures for potential customers. Federal Tax Credits UPDATED 8/2022

Some forms of electric generation systems can qualify for a tax credit of: Photovoltaic, Wind Turbine, and Fuel Cell. Consult with your tax professional for actual detail and processes.

- 30% for systems placed in service on or before 12/31/2032
- 26% for systems placed in service after 12/31/2032 and before 01/01/2033
- 22% for systems placed in service after 12/31/2033 and before 01/01/2034
- Expires: December 31, 2034

Details: In most cases, existing home and new construction qualify; Both principle and secondary homes qualify. Rentals DO NOT qualify.

Washington State Renewable Energy System Incentive Program

UPDATE: Due to the high level of interest in the Washington State Renewable Incentive Program for individual generating systems and the funding limitations prescribed in the governing legislation this program is currently closed for individual net metering projects.

These programs are Washington State programs which they fund through tax revenue and provides incentive based on participating customers annual energy production. These programs are managed by Washington State University extension energy program for utilities that choose to participate as a pass-through for the program. To participate applicants must be pre-approved by the utility and WSU before systems can be put in place.
