They wake before the sun, pour steaming cups of coffee and kiss their families goodbye. After swinging by the office to get the day's orders, crews climb into their trucks and head out.

Klickitat PUD's lineworkers form a solid team with one job: to deliver safe, reliable electricity. But that job can change in a million ways when rough weather steps in.

Linemen have to work safely, smartly and efficiently—all while 40 feet in the air, sometimes near live electrical lines or from behind a hot-stick.

On a typical day, lineworkers maintain electrical distribution and transmission lines, or build service to new homes and businesses.

They have a lot on their plates. But when Klickitat PUD's operations center calls with a problem, everything else takes a back seat.

Power restoration takes precedence over a lineworker's daily to-do list. These brave men are always on call. Crews stand by to serve you 24 hours a day, in the middle of the night or wee hours of
